



We hate to keep bringing up the subject of dogs but we have a few members who don't control their pets. The Woodrun rules clearly state in Section B-4:

Pet owners are required to keep their pets under control at all times. If pets are permitted to run loose and become a problem to other property owners or the wildlife at Woodrun they will have to be removed.

The owners of these pets are not in compliance! We've had the granddaughter of a member bitten. Remember if your pet injures someone and/or damages property the owner can be held liable in civil court. This issue has come up too many times and these owners need to step up and become responsible pet owners. People also need to report problems with loose dogs to the Sheriff (911). We urge you to document the incident with photos if you can safely take them.

What's Cookin'

Chocolate Cherry Cake Faye Dodd

1 pkg chocolate cake mix	1C chocolate chips
1 can cherry pie filling	1 C sugar
1 tsp almond extract	5 Tbsp margarine
2 eggs	1/3 C milk

Mix cake mix, cherries, almond extract and eggs. Bake in a greased 9x13 inch pan at 350 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes. In a saucepan, mix sugar, margarine and milk; boil 1 minute. Remove from heat. Add chocolate chips; stir until smooth.

Pour over cake.
