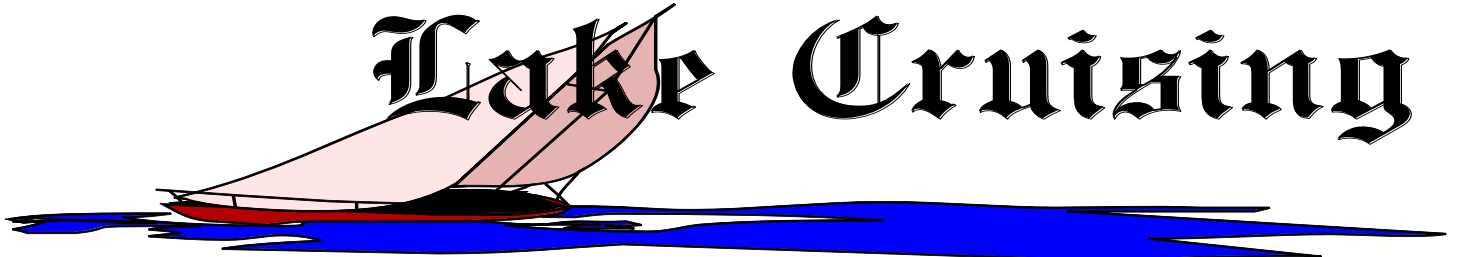

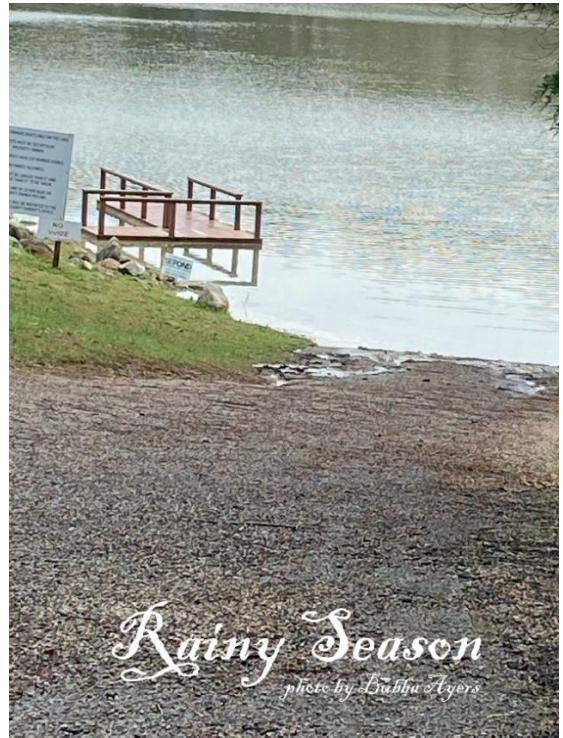
Thank you, Brenda, for a gift that keeps giving to all of us.
